46% Grenache; 39% Syrah; 10% Mourvedre; 5% Counoise. In this effort, one finds the complex layering and structure belonging to wines of high accomplishment. Its strawberry fruit steers well wide of the frontal, candied side of the Grenache and picks up a wealth of spice, leather and toasted vanilla, and in so doing, has reminiscences of Chateauneuf du Papes in its makeup. Still, it is all California in its ongoing fruit content, and we would serve it with dishes like duck in currant sauce rather than heavier beef or lamb dishes. It is made all the more inviting by its price.
