REVIEWS

2023 Esprit de Tablas Blanc

95 points

“Wet slate and granite aromas and flavors join subtle spices on a palate of concentration and length. White licorice, citrus and apples linger with lanolin and quietly lifted lemon blossoms. Structure and generosity in equal measure. Drink or hold, but best after 2026 and for more than a decade after.”

2024 Côtes de Tablas Blanc

93 points

“Very pretty viognier aromatics with ripe stone fruit and a sweep of orange blossoms. These find balance in mineral-tinged notes of citrus and beeswax on a plush texture. Fresh and layered. Drink or hold.”

2024 Grenache Blanc

92 points

“Vibrant with solid cut to the minerals and citrus. White licorice and autumn orchard fruit remain incisive throughout, carried on a lovely tactile palate through the finish. Drink or hold.”

2024 Patelin de Tablas Rosé

92 points

“Lovely purity to the cherry aromas and flavors, which are joined on the fresh, vivid palate by oranges, spices and a lingering seam of minerality. Very good concentration and texture, ending on a savory sweep. Drink now.”

2024 Dianthus Rosé

93 points

“Dominated by Mourvèdre and grenache, this well-extracted rosé starts off with compressed watermelon and wild-strawberry aromas and flavors. Spiced crushed cherries and minerals, as well as orange pith, linger through the savory, structured finish. Drink or hold for the next year or two.”

2023 Esprit de Tablas

96 points

“Savory, well-spiced and meaty, showing plums and warm figs, sanguine flavors and black licorice. Outstanding posture and length with harmony between the scorched earth and blackberries, cherry pits and cured olives. Best after 2028 and for the next several decades.”



2023 Côtes de Tablas**94 points**

“Generous, alive and complicated with a medicinal dark-cherry cast to the fruit. Savory spices and iron-rich meaty flavors interweave with brambleberries and earth. A wine of many layers. Of note, this has a higher percentage of Grenache than any previous vintage since 2006. Drink or hold.”

2024 Patelin de Tablas**93 points**

“Peppercorn-rubbed bacon and crushed-cherry aromas. On the juicy yet structured palate, taut acidity and a mineral spine lend crunchiness through the brambly, meaty, licorice-kissed finish. Drink or hold.”

2023 Grenache**94 points**

“A savory expression of grenache with depth, spices and a meaty quality not typically found in the variety in Paso. Punched-up minerality and taut acidity make for a crunchy mouthfeel, but there is still plenty of berry and cherry fruit for friendliness. Fascinating and long. Drink or hold, but best after 2026.”

2023 Syrah**94 points**

“Dark in color and character with meaty, cracked-peppercorn aromas and flavors. Plush and structured with a pulse of acidity. Blackberries, bacon, minerals and blood orange-tinged peppercorns are detailed and long through the finish. Drink or hold, but best to wait.”

2023 Vaccarèse**92 points**

“A wine of fascinating juxtapositions: tar and flowers, brambleberries and blood oranges, tannic structure and higher-toned acidity. It’s an obscure variety even in its native France, much less in Paso, but this fascinating, layered wine proves its worth with length, crunchiness and idiosyncrasy. Drink or hold.”

2023 Panoplie**95 points**

“Showing abundant energy and cut, this has a deep core of minerals anchoring black raspberries, mixed forest fruit and scorched earth on an expansive palate. Long, precise yet generous through the lengthy finish. Best after 2028 and for the next 15 or 20 years or more.”

2023 En Gobelet**94 points**

“This starts off with cured olives and forest berries, joined by a savory, assertive tannic structure that hugs spiced, chewy flavors of dark cherries and earth. A wine of impressive texture and presence. Crafted entirely from head-trained and dry-farmed fruit. Drink or hold, but best after 2027.”

2023 Le Complice**95 points**

“Scrubby herbs fleck iron-rich brambleberries, black cherries and spices. Chewy, detailed and propulsive with an incisiveness to the midpalate and finish, both of which balance power and definition. Great bones. Drink or hold.”
